Advent. The arrival of a notable person or thing. For Christians, Advent is a four week season of preparation for that special arrival of the Christ child. We celebrate this time with reflections on hope, peace, love, and joy envelops our world. Each week we light a new candle as we prepare for the light of the Christ child's arrival.

From the first story to the last, the Bible is full of narratives, poetry, prophecy, biographies, and personal letters that inform our understanding of Advent. When the Bible talks about humans waiting for the promised anointed King who would deliver them, it can help us connect with their anticipation (Amos 9:11-13). When we read about people choosing joy and hope in God's promises despite their circumstances, the meaning of Advent can take on a deeper meaning (Isa. 9:6-7, 11:1-5; Luke 1:26-2:20). And when the New Testament talks about a second advent, the return of Jesus, we can join in that time of waiting, shared by Christians throughout history (Rev. 21:1-5).

Advent symbolizes the church's present situation in these "last days" (Acts 2:17, Hebrews 1:2) as God's people wait for the return of Christ in glory to consummate his eternal kingdom. The church is in a similar situation to Israel at the end of the Old Testament: in exile, waiting and hoping in prayerful expectation for the coming of the Messiah. Israel looked back to God's past gracious actions on their behalf in leading them out of Egypt in the Exodus, and on this basis, they called for God once again to act for them. In the same way, the church, during Advent, looks back upon Christ's coming in celebration while at the same time looking forward in eager anticipation to the coming of Christ's kingdom when he returns for his people.

Culturally the four weeks before Christmas is consumed in preparation for the holiday. Shopping, cleaning, decorating, and other activities dominate our time. In the midst of all this busy-ness, we hear the voices of the prophets calling for us to pause and reflect on the reason for the season – preparing for the arrival of the

promised Savior. So take some time to slow down and prepare for the holy-day that we all await – The Nativity of our Lord, Christmas. Reflect, Repent, and be Renewed. That will bring the light of a Merry Christmas.

We would like to thank the Welcome Committee for our Veteran's Recognition event on Sunday, November 10th as well as thank all those who helped make our Election Day sale a success.

Our annual January congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, January 19th with a snow date of Sunday, January 26th. Please add this to your calendars.

On Saturday, October 12th there was a Sharing Pastoral Resources Gathering which was held here at Our Saviour and attended by nine congregations from both the east and west shores. At this gathering Zion Lutheran Church in Dauphin asked to have a meeting with us to begin a conversation about sharing pastoral resources. Our council members met with their council members at Our Saviour on Wednesday, November 6th to discuss the possibility of working together to share a pastor.

Zion has a weekly attendance of about 50-60 members and owns their church building like we do. They are in the process of calling a part-time pastor. Unfortunately, they have been in this process for almost two years without any success. They cannot support a full-time pastor. They presently have a part time interim pastor like we do.

At our September 2023 congregational meeting, Council was asked to look into the possibility of Our Saviour having a part time pastor instead of a full-time one when looking at our church finances.

Both church councils feel that working together we could possibly find a full-time pastor that would work with both churches.

Our next step is to speak with Synod about our next steps. We will keep you updated on this. Please reach out to any council member with any questions or comments you have.

Evangelical Lutheran Church of Our Saviour Minutes of the Regular Council Meeting Thursday, October 10, 2024

Members Present: Pastor Joel Petruschke, Brad Neil, Jim Lubrecht, Jeanette Logan, Penny Zimmerman, Carol Ranck, Deb Flage and Sandy Moritz.

Members Absent: Steve Barron and Joel Hains

Guest: Pastor Beth Martini from Synod

Meeting was called to order at 5:50 pm. Brad offered a prayer.

Election of Executive Committee: Carol nominated Brad for President. Deb seconded the nomination. Everyone voted in favor of the motion.

Deb nominated Carol for Vice-President. Sandy seconded the nomination. Everyone voted in favor of the motion.

Carol nominated Jim for Treasurer. Jeanette seconded the nomination. Everyone voted in favor of the motion.

Jeanette nominated Penny for Secretary. Penny declined the nomination. Sandy nominated Deb for Secretary. Brad seconded the nomination. Everyone voted in favor of the motion.

Executive Committee for 2024-2025:

President – Brad Neil; Vice-President – Carol Ranck; Treasurer – Jim Lubrecht; Secretary – Deb Flage

Discussion with Pastor Beth: Pastor Joel stepped out of the meeting while Council talked with Pastor Beth Martini. Council members introduced themselves to Pastor Beth. She explained that an interim pastor serves when a vacancy arises. Council can sign a contract for an interim pastor; it does not need to go to the congregation for a vote. The contract has a 30-day clause for either party to end it. Supply pastors can be used to 'fill in' until an interim is selected. For a called pastor, a Call Committee is formed to review candidates and when narrowed to one candidate, the congregation votes on the call.

Sharing arrangements between congregations can be just pastoral ministry or sharing of other activities within the churches. This can be done with a contract arrangement or the congregations working together. Pastor Richard Jorgensen from Synod is the person who is more versed in the various arrangements that churches can use with each other. We had been informed that Zion Lutheran in Dauphin and St. Michaels in Harrisburg are looking for future arrangements. Looking at partners is often financially driven.

Pastor Frank Terhune has been offered by Synod as an interim pastor for OSL. We will ask him to preach on Reformation Sunday as a supply pastor so the congregation can either meet him or be reintroduced to him. Council discussed considering Pastor Terhune as an interim for consistency for our congregation. Carol made a motion that we ask Pastor Terhune to preach on Reformation Sunday and Council have a conversation with him about being our interim pastor. Jeanette seconded the motion. All were in favor; the motion passed. Brad will contact Pastor Terhune.

Approval of Council Minutes from September 11, 2024: Carol made a motion to accept the minutes with one correction. Sandy's last name under Guests should be changed from Haney to

Moritz. Brad seconded the motion. All were in favor; the minutes were approved as corrected.

Treasurer's Report: Jim reported that there is currently a deficit of \$14, 819.55. He passed around invoices paid since the last meeting for everyone to review. Prorated Pension/Disability won't be paid which is about \$8,000. Brad noted that donations exceed the cost of the new heater.

Jim noted that the scholarship mutuals have increased \$22,000 since January 2024. He handed out a summary of GermanFest income and expenses. There is a Finance Committee meeting on November 7 to discuss next year's budget. All council members are welcome to attend.

Pastor's Report: Reminder about October 12 meeting on Sharing Pastoral Resources. About 20 people from 7 churches responded they are coming. November 2 is a Thriving Together meeting which focuses on removing systemic racism. Nadine and Otis have participated in this along with Pastor Joel. November 10 will be the recognition of Veterans Day; the 1st Sunday Social will be held that day.

Updating the Membership Roll – Brad made a motion to remove Gretchen Blacksmith from our membership per her request. Carol seconded the motion. The motion carried. Council agreed to give another month for responses to the letters Barb has sent. The last page of the handout is members we do not have current addresses for. It was suggested to ask other family members if they know what these people would like to do regarding their membership with OSL.

Visioning Team – creating the new logo is on the to-do list.

Attestation of Record and Financial Requirements – this is a requirement for Pastor Joel to complete before he leaves. The form was signed by Deb as Secretary, Jim as Treasurer and Brad as President. Pastor will make a copy for church records.

OLD BUSINESS

Update on Membership Roll – discussed during Pastor's report above

GermanFest – There seemed to be fewer attendees than last year but all agreed it was a successful event. A one-time expense was incurred for the new T-shirts that were ordered. A wrap-up meeting is scheduled for October 23.

Update of new positions open on Mutual Ministry committee – Carol had previously volunteered to be on this committee. Carol suggested that Council review and update the committee list of

members and chairpersons. Jeanette noted that Council needs to know/follow up if someone responds to a request in the bulletin.

IT Committee - on hold

Building/property evaluation committee – on hold. Council discussed the shed that will be purchased for our property. The money is coming out of the Memorial Fund and is earmarked for the shed. Carol will check the Constitution and Bylaws to see if the Congregation needs to vote on the purchase (approx. \$5,000). Brad will order the shed after talking to Susquehanna Township about the schematic, shed placement and walkway.

NEW BUSINESS

Pastor Joel – synod evaluation form – Brad, Carol and Jim held an exit interview with Pastor Joel on Tuesday, October 8. Pastor sent an email including the Covenant of Closure and exit evaluation form. Carol is compiling a 'to-do' list based on the exit interview.

Update to congregation from this Council meeting – Inform them of who is on the Executive Committee, our conversation with Pastor Beth and the proposed part-time interim pastor, Pastor Frank Terhune. Election Day – Sue DeArmitt and Alice will come in early to open up on Election Day. Jeanette will put out sign-up sheets this Sunday for covering the various 2-hour shifts during the day. Jim will get money for them to start with and give it to Alice.

Farewell luncheon – The cost to the church will be \$12 per person for a spaghetti dinner. There is \$200 in the Welcome Committee budget. We will need to determine where the remainder of the money is coming from. Jim noted we could use the pension money that will not be spent to cover the difference. Council will authorize the expense when we receive the bill.

Deb made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Sandy seconded the motion and all were in favor. The meeting adjourned at 8:50 pm.

The next Council meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, November 13 at 6:00 pm.
