Our "2nd Sunday" food collection is still ongoing. During this time of the pandemic food pantries are still seeing a greater demand of their services. If you would like to make a donation you may bring your items into the church & place them on the table in the Narthex at any time. There is a list of suggested items now on the table. If you are not comfortable with coming into the church building we would be happy to offer "curbside drop-off" during regular office hours. Just let us know & we will be happy to come out & get your donation from you. Soroptimist International of Harrisburg is hosting a Diaper Drive for Healthy Steps Diaper Bank at the during the month of September. A box has been placed in the Narthex and Alice Lubrecht will make sure the box reaches the Diaper Bank after October 3. This is the bank that provides packages of diapers to the various food pantries in the Harrisburg area – including Hannah Pantry in Susquehanna Township.



### Some Quick Facts:

- 1 out of 3 families struggle to buy diapers.
- 44% of mothers nationwide report having times when they have had to choose between buying diapers or food/other necessities because they couldn't afford both.
- 43% of Pennsylvanian children under age 6 live in low-income families, with 22% of those children living in poverty.
- A child uses between 6-10 diapers/day depending on their age. And so disposable diapers cost \$70-\$80/month.
- Cloth diapers are not a viable option for many low-income families. Daycares require disposable diapers, **and laundromats don't allow the cleaning of cloth diapers at their facilities.**

### Did You Know:

- We provide on average **30,000** diapers a month to local families in need.
- We provided **467,670** diapers in 2020.
- Babies born into low-income families can spend all day or longer in one diaper. Some parents are forced to reuse diapers.
- **We accept open packages, diapers, Pull Ups and wipes. Our most needed sizes are 5, 6, Pull Ups.**
- We have remained fully operational during the pandemic. Our distribution has gone up 39%!
